



From the Principal...

Dear Carlisle Family



Easter is nearly here! This will trigger thoughts of chocolate and a long weekend! But I am reminded that Easter is about something more than chocolates and a long weekend—it is about the sacrifice made by our Lord Jesus. The Bible teaches that Jesus paid the penalty for our sins by giving His life as a ransom for us, making it possible for each of us to have eternal life! What a great gift this is! And—its free! Imagine that! Praise God for His amazing love! God says in the Bible “..and this is the way to have eternal life – to **know you**, the only true God and Jesus Christ, the one you sent to Earth.” Gospel of John, Chapter 17, verse 3. So have a VERY happy Easter everyone!

Looking back on our first term, I would like to highlight the great work of our Student Representative Council (SRC). They are meeting regularly and reporting to other members of the council ideas from their classmates. Already they have discussed plans to organise good things for our school. From their last meeting the following suggestions went to staff for endorsement:

- That the Sport Shed lines get repainted. They have suggested a Mufti Day to raise money for this. The idea is for everyone to dress-up as their favourite sport person for the day. Friday, May 7 is the suggested day—after senior exams and before NAPLAN. **(Staff agree, so lock this in!)**
- For a community fundraiser they thought a cancer fundraising event would be the go. Apparently, on Thursday, May 27, is Australia’s Biggest Morning Tea: Could we do a Mufti Fundraiser for cancer and morning tea together on that day? - They like the idea of everyone eating healthy fruit on a Tuesday. Maybe P&F could sponsor a fruit basket for students to access? **(Staff agree, so we are working on a plan!)**
- They want to see inter-house competitions like Lego Masters! **(Staff agree, so we are working on a plan!)**

- They would like to see a mentoring system formalised where Prep goes with Yr6 and Yr 7 goes with yr 12. This could be a very positive thing. (**Staff agree, so we are working on a plan!**)

Again this year, a group of dedicated P&F are leading out in finding ways to incorporate the new logo into our school uniform. Consequently, they are mindful of the real possibility of some uniform items changing, but that those changes will come after a thorough discussion has taken place. We have experienced and knowledgeable people involved in this process (see photo previous pg.) who realise that any changes will need to be phased in, within a reasonable timeframe. 




