## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Carlisle Family

Imagine if your child's teacher taught a lesson on the importance of speaking respectfully to each other and using good manners. Would the teacher's message have more, or less impact, if the students saw the same teacher yelling and swearing at a colleague after school?

We all remember the Golden Rule from when we were young, "Treat other's the way you would like to be treated yourself". At Carlisle we still believe in the Golden Rule.

If our children see that our words and actions are consistent because we live our lives the way we recommend or say we do, it will generate more respect and trust towards us. Our children are then more likely to reciprocate in kind with their words and actions. Currently as a school community we are spending time and money to work together to create a school charter to guide the way we treat each other. This program is called Class Act. Our students in middle primary and above are participating alongside all our staff, and parents who choose to be involved. The result will be a clear set of guidelines which reflect the priorities our college community identifies as most important when we interact together in a manner known as a "class act." Our words and how we say them are vitally important!

Our words are very powerful. Have a look at these quotes.

# Principal's Message (Cont...)

§“The tongue has no bones but is strong enough to break a heart. So be careful with your words.” “A broken bone can heal, but the wound a word opens can fester forever.”

§“Don’t mix bad words with your bad mood. You will have many opportunities to change a mood, but you will never get the opportunity to replace the words you spoke.”

§“The tongue is the only tool that gets sharper with use.”

§“A slip of the foot you may soon recover, but a slip of the tongue you may never get over.” Benjamin Franklin

§“It’s better to bite your tongue than to eat your words.” Frank Sonnenberg

The Bible also has much to say about the power of our words:

·Proverbs 25:18 “Telling lies about others is as harmful as hitting them with an axe, wounding them with a sword, or shooting them with a sharp arrow.”

·Proverbs 26:20 “Without wood a fire goes out; without a gossip a quarrel dies down.”

·Proverbs 21:23 “Whoever watches his mouth and tongue keeps himself from trouble.”

·Proverbs 11:9 “Evil words destroy one’s friends; wise discernment rescues the godly.”

·Proverbs 15:1 “A gentle answer turns away wrath, but hard words stir up anger.”

The following Bible quote is my favourite. It has saved me much embarrassment personally:

·Proverbs 17:28. “Even a fool can seem smart if they keep their mouth shut!”

I invite all members of our Carlisle school family to prioritise speaking positive words in a polite manner. “Manner” must come before “matter.”

Together with God’s help we can train our children to speak in a way that distinguishes them as a “Class Act.”



# Mackay District Math Team Challenge



