

Students are encouraged to get help early if they are having difficulty in their subjects. Carlisle offers free tutoring at school Wednesday afternoons from 3:30-4:30pm and during lunch times.

The Year 11 information evening is coming up on the 10th August from 5:30pm – 7:00pm. The evening is put aside for parents (in any year) to come and find out how the ATAR and QCE system works and to chat to teachers about pathways that we offer for our students. We will have our senior teachers there to discuss subjects and there will be some external providers from local universities and certificate providers. This is a great opportunity to start or continue the discussion about pathways especially as we begin set plans with our year 10 students.

Parents School Improvement Survey








Mufti Day Fundraiser (Above)


