

BEHAVIOURAL PROCESS

Our Behavioural Process can be found in Documents on SEQTA Engage. This is the system that we have been rolling out this year at Carlisle. Last newsletter, we looked at Tier 2, today we will unpack Tier 3.



Students progress onto a Tier 3 when the intensity and frequency of their behaviour hasn't lessened on a Tier 2. Students can also be escalated onto a Tier 3 if for certain behaviors (see behaviour guideline in SEQTA Engage). The first step of a Tier 3 is for parents to come into the school for a wrap around conversation with the Principal, Deputy Principal, Welfare Coordinator and other supporting staff. The purpose of the meeting is to talk about the supports that we as a school have been providing and unpack what can happen at home to further support the student. The student then completes a CICO with the Deputy Principal over a week. Part of that process is having an alternate lunch time area.

After a week if the intensity and frequency of the behaviour has decreased then the student is deescalated to a Tier 2. If the intensity and frequency hasn't decreased then the student is suspended for a length of time decided by the Principal. After the suspension, parents come in for a re-entry interview and the student returns to school on a Tier 3 CICO for another week. The CICO is reviewed after the week and the student either deescalates to a Tier 2 or another wrap around conversation takes place about de-registration/exclusion.

Our behavioural process is there as a support system for our students. From the beginning of the year we have had 14 students on a Tier 3 and over 85% of them have successfully worked their way back down into a Tier 1 with the support of staff and teachers working together to help them modify their behaviour and make right choices.

YEAR 7 WOODWORK AT MCC


The Year 7 class have been sharpening their woodwork skills in the Trade Training Centre at Mackay Christian College. Here are some photos of what they've been up to,
