I would like to share with you some fantastic news and an exciting new venture that will be occurring at Carlisle Adventist College in 2023 and beyond. As most of you would know, our school has continued to grow exponentially from its humble beginnings.

As it stands, we have families on waiting lists in a number of grades and our ELC is experiencing the same growth and waiting lists in each of their rooms. In fact, we have now reached a point where the ELC is providing more Prep students than we have spots available. Even some new families have realised the challenge of enrolling their children at Carlisle. It is not our desire that anyone should miss out and we understand the healthy dilemma we find ourselves in.

Recently, the Board of Directors met and in consultation with the school and other stakeholders has made the decision to add a second Prep class to the school in 2023. Arrangements are currently in place to ensure we have the classroom to facilitate the second Prep class. As part of this gradual process, we would then add another Year 1 class in 2024 and so forth each year. This will be a gradual process allowing us to create more enrolment space at a pace which does not cause major disruption to our school culture.

This will ensure that we are providing the community with greater opportunity to be part of the Christian education and culture we offer at Carlisle. I want to assure you that the small, family community that has made Carlisle a success will always remain at the heart of everything we do here. We do not endeavour to lose sight of our special character and within these four walls will always remain a community where your child is personally known and valued.


