



Carrying on from the success of our Independent Band Workshops, we are excited to be offering not one, but two string ensembles this year run by a very experienced teacher, Chelsea, who has been part of the Mackay community for years. She will be working with our students who are both starting out and those who enjoy a challenge.

The ensembles will begin this Thursday, 23rd February. The more advanced ensemble will be during secondary lunch at 12:46-1:26 pm and the junior ensemble will be at 1:30-2:30 pm. Chelsea also has a number of available places for lessons if you would like your child/ren to do lessons here on-site. Below, is an introduction from Chelsea.

I have played the Violin for the past 30 years and entered the teaching profession in 2015. I have had 8 years of teaching experience and 7 years of ensemble/conducting experience. I am currently studying a Bachelor of Music degree at the Central Queensland Conservatorium of Music. I have studied to the AMus level of the Australian Music Examinations Board (AMEB) syllabus. Recently I undertook a conducting subject within my music degree where my conducting and ensemble direction was assessed by a reputable industry professional, achieving Distinction.

My ensembles have achieved multiple Gold awards in Mackay Orchestras and Band competitions and placed highly in Eisteddfods including 1st place in the secondary school's orchestra section. In 2016 I was part of a Support Act for Australian singer Damien Leith on the Queensland leg of his national Roy Orbison tour at the Gold Coast. I have been the Violinist for local Mackay band 3Way Crossing for the past 10 years, where we have performed extensively at both public and private functions (including the main stage at Food and Wine Festival and Global Grooves Festival) and travelled to play at popular music festivals including Winterfest in Biloela.

I specialise in preparing and coaching students for performance including dealing with performance anxiety, having suffered from it myself as a child learning. I help students instil confidence within themselves from the very beginning, and I show students not just what to practise but how to practise. I help them set goals and guide them to do their best to achieve them.

I specialise in Violin tuition primarily but do offer Cello instruction. I look forward to building a strings community at Carlisle in 2023 and beyond and hope to welcome new students and establish solid ensemble foundations.


