

This year we are using an electronic platform called Consent2go to streamline and fasten all processes to do with school excursions, permission slips, camps and healthcare. You would have received an e-mail from the school entitled "Student Profile Update Invitation'. It will look like the photo above. Please check your junk email if you have not received it and add Carlisle as a Safe Sender so you continue to receive our emails. We kindly ask that you check your child's medicals details and confirm our records.

SEQTA ENGAGE



SEQTA Engage is a school app to help keep you informed of what is happening at Carlisle. The SEQTA app allows you to see your child/ren Term reports, subjects, and what uniform to wear. In the Secondary School you can also see your child/ren timetable and assessments. New technology can be daunting for some, so if you are unsure how to set up SEQTA please follow the 7 step instructions on page 8 of this newsletter.







SCHOOL DROP-OFF AND PICK UP

To help with the congestion of traffic, we kindly ask that if you are going to walk your child into the school or would like to meet them for pick up, that you use the back carpark for parking and leave the front for the 'kiss and drop'. When driving in at pick-up times, please have your family name displayed on your car visor so that those on duty can call out your child/ren. If you do not have a car visor, please notify the office.

Another important note, Secondary students are able to walk home but if they are waiting for a parent or Guardian please remain inside the gates for own safety and congestion.



SCHOOL HOURS

The first bell rings at 8:38 am so that students are lining up and ready at 8:40 am. Supervision begins at 8:15 am and students need to be sitting in the quad with their school bags. School finishes at 3:00 pm for Primary and . If you would like to meet and talk about your child's progress or any issues, we ask that you contact the teacher through email to arrange an appointment as the mornings are busy and it's important that we give your concern the right time and attention.





UNIFORMS

Please ensure that your child is in the correct uniform each day. If your child needs to wear the incorrect uniform, please email the school at studentservices@carlisle.qld.edu.au or send a note with them so that they can be issued a white uniform pass. A yellow uniform pass is issued if there is no reason, three yellow passes in a week, result in a lunchtime reflection. A reminder that we have a no hat, no play policy at Carlisle.



SCHOOL YEAR BEGINS ON A POSITIVE NOTE







For the first time in our school history, we commenced the 2023 school year with a Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L) Fun Day. The 'Fun Day' was designed with activities that centered around our schools 4 core values of **Achievement**, **Compassion, Growth Mindset and Belonging**.

To demonstrate Achievement- Students participated in Team building games. Compassion- The students cooked meals for a local ADRA Charity Service "Mealtime on Milton."

Growth Mindset- Students took part in a Bible escape room.

Belonging- Every student placed their painted handprint on a mural and painted rocks for our school garden.

Our Deputy Principal Mrs Millien said, "It was great to create an atmosphere on the first day of school where you could see returning and new students mingling with each other and staff in a relaxed and happy environment. It sets a positive tone for the remainder of the year."

The PB4L framework is a school-wide approach to behaviour and learning as well as an individual child perspective. It's an evidence-based approach that fosters behavioural support and builds respectful relationships within schools. It is not a system There will be many more PB4L Fun Days and initiatives throughout the year at Carlisle.

In another school first, we formally prayed and dedicated our school, students and leaders to God in 2023 during the first day of school. Thank you to all families who joined us on the day. It was also a great moment to introduce new staff and welcome new and existing families.





PREP'S FINDING THEIR FEET

The first Term of any school year is always a challenge as student's adapt to new teachers, new classrooms, new friendship groups, and an endless possibility of new unknowns. This can be an even harder time for our younger learners starting "Big School" or those who are moving on from Prep last year. Therefore, we decided to check in on our Prep classes this week to ensure they are finding their feet at Carlisle.

Separation anxiety is quite common in the early years and no two children are ever the same. Some are happy to run off from the gate, while others will need more time to adjust. Whichever category your child may fall into, know that either scenario is a normal expected part of childhood.

It can be guilt-inducing and worrying for us as parents when we see our children crying or ignoring us at drop off. We wanted to provide a small glimpse of what the classroom and routine has looked like for our Prep students after our parents leave for the day. From sitting attentively in morning assembly, to focusing on classroom tasks, and playing with each other; the children are gradually adapting to routine.






CERT II AUTOMOTIVE VOCATIONAL PREPARATION
