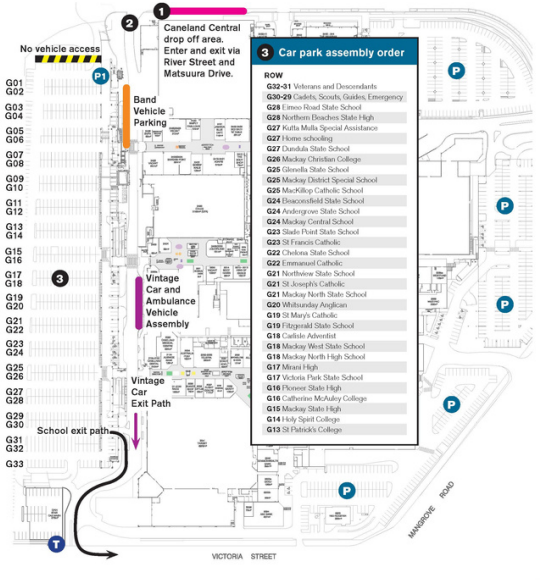

DEFENCE FORCE VISIT YEARS 10-12 STUDENTS

With our Twilight Careers Expo coming up on April 27th, it was a great opportunity to catch the Defence Force Recruiting Team as they travelled through Mackay last Thursday. Sergeant Hudson (Air Force) and Corporal Hartley (Army), talked about working in the defence force and doing life with their families and enjoying the usual civilian activities. Both gentlemen spoke of their experiences being deployed to assist Australia's allies, carrying out exercises at home and abroad, and contributing to relief like the NQ floods, while working in their defence jobs. They both excel in careers as sportsmen (Rugby Union and Soccer) and talked about athlete pathways and playing for Australia and defence teams. It was exciting to hear about Sergeant Hudson's additional role of coaching the women's rugby team for the Rugby 7s World Cup in France last year.

With several pathways into a defence force career, the best place to access information is their website defencejobs.gov.au. They also offer school leavers a gap year program and, in most cases, individuals leave with work-ready, transferrable skills and qualifications like forklift and heavy vehicle driving licenses.

For students who are at least 15 years of age, there is a Defence Work Experience Program that provides an opportunity to gain exposure to a range of jobs available within the Australian Defence Force and/or the Department of Defence too. If this is something students are interested in, please look at the information on the defence website and have a conversation with Mrs Peet:

With the evolving technology and improvement in defence capabilities, the defence force employs a diverse range of individuals through several pathways. So, if you're interested in finding out whether a career in defence would suit you, the only way to find out is through registering an expression of interest in defence careers to have a conversation with a mentor and coach from defence to help answer any questions you have and lead you through important decisions.

What's new in OSHC?

Australia's National framework for school aged care is called My Time Our Place. This framework is a tool to guide educators to provide children with opportunities to maximise their potential and develop a foundation of lifelong learning.

Recently the MTOP framework has been revised by six project leaders from three Australian universities, including Dr Francis Bobongie Harris from QUT, who has strong ties within our Carlisle community. The process ensured that My Time Our Place supports the foundations and provision for high-quality education and care across the school age sector.

The framework is made up on the vision of Belonging, Being and Becoming, Principles, Practices and the 5 outcomes which are.

- Outcome 1:** Children and young people have a strong sense of community.
- Outcome 2:** Children and young people are connected with and contribute to their world.
- Outcome 3:** Children and young people have a strong sense of wellbeing.
- Outcome 4:** Children and young people are confident and involved learners.
- Outcome 5:** Children and young people are effective communicators.

Both Sandra and I are currently participating in ongoing Professional Development on the revised My Time Our Place to ensure that we successfully implement these changes to our daily program and practice.

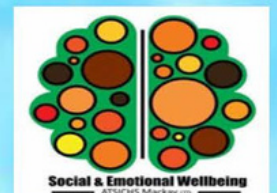
