ANZAC DAY INFORMATION 2023

Primary and high school students are to use the Caneland Central drop-off area along Matsuura Drive (1, pink).

Either drop your child off in the allocated drop-off area or park in the upper-level car parking (P1) or around Caneland Central and walk your child to the ground-level Caneland Central car park (3, green).

Parking is available in the upper-level car park (P1) of the Caneland Central Shopping Centre via the ramp off Matsuura Drive. Vehicles will only be able to exit after the parade concludes if they choose to park in this location. There is also parking around Caneland Central Shopping Centre (P).

Road closures will be in place along the parade route. Please adhere to all roadside signage and instructions. The Mangrove Road and Milton Street intersection will be closed from 8am (yellow-black). Allow plenty of time to get to the Caneland Central car park.

Students, are to assemble in the Caneland Central ground-level car park by 8am. Rows have been allocated for each school/group. Our school will be in G-18. The parade will move onto Victoria Street at 8.35am and march along Wellington and Alfred streets.

Following the march, students will be directed to wait on Nelson Street for parents to

pick up.
