
The ADRA Op Shop are in need of volunteers as they have had a few people retire in recent weeks.

Weekly sessions are full of songs and rhymes, actions and movement, designed to engage you and your child. Not only will your little one be delighted by the one-to-one attention you give, but you'll love the way they respond and develop.

You'll be creating memories together.

The structured 30 minute music session will be followed by 30-60 minutes of eat/play/chat. Snacks and refreshments will be served, followed by a time of unstructured play. At the same time, you'll be able to connect with others.

"What's really helped me from the group sessions was the realisation of the fact that every family has their share of tough times and issues. Being part of a group where most people are going through similar stages in their lives has really helped."

Accept that initially (and quite possibly at other times) your child's behaviour might not model what you had hoped. That's okay. We all have off days! Feel free to ask for help from the local team. We all have these parenting moments.

Sometimes children participate, maybe observing for a while. That's okay. We accept that

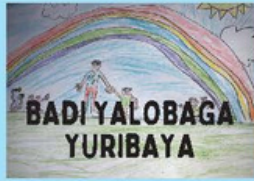

Is your teenager struggling to attend school due to anxiety, depression or emotional distress?

Be among the first to trial a new online parenting program designed to support parents of teens struggling with school attendance.

Researchers from Monash University and Deakin University are offering parents a **FREE online parenting program** designed to support parents of teenagers who have **difficulty attending school due to anxiety, depression, or emotional distress** (sometimes called 'school refusal', 'school can't', or 'school phobia'). The program is being offered as part of a research trial.

What's included in the program?

- A parenting self-assessment tool with personalised feedback
- Up to 13 online modules with practical strategies to support your teen's mental health and school attendance
- Complete weekly modules and work towards goals

Who can take part?

- You may be eligible to participate if:
- you are the parent or guardian of a teenager aged 12-18
 - live in Australia
 - can read, write, and speak in English,
 - have regular access to the Internet.

The program is not recommended as a sole source of support for young people experiencing school refusal. We recommend seeking professional support from a mental health or education professional alongside completing this program. Although all parents are able to take part, please also note that the program content is not tailored for parents of teenagers with Autism Spectrum Disorder or intellectual disability.

What else is involved?

To help us evaluate the program, we'll ask you to complete two online surveys about your parenting and your teen's mental health. We may also invite you to complete an interview about your experience with the program. You'll receive a \$20 gift voucher after completing the second survey, and an additional \$20 gift voucher if you complete an interview.

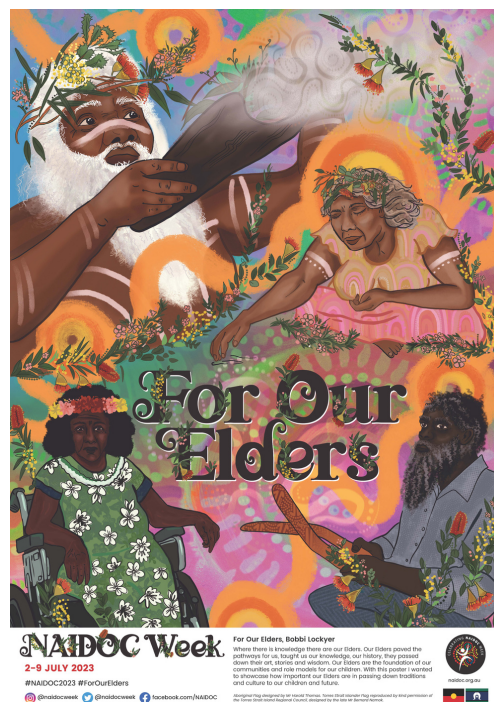
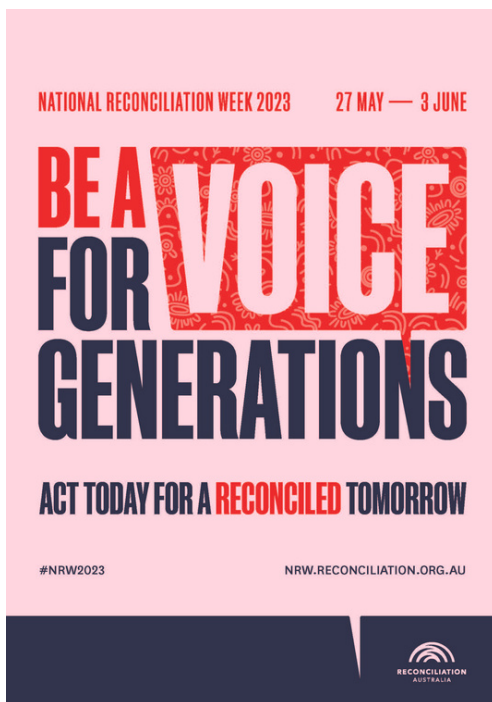

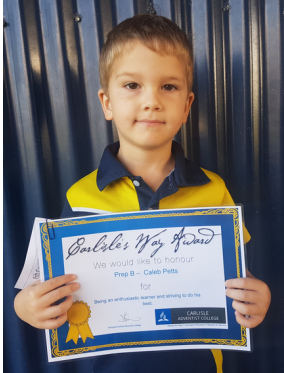

HEALTHY IDEAS

At Carlisle, we want to promote the healthy development of our students to help them with concentration and focus so they can grow to be the very best version of themselves.

We all know that when providing food to our young people, fresh is best however we understand that with our busy lifestyles, packaged foods can be a quick and convenient alternative when packing daily lunchboxes. Unfortunately, a lot of those packaged foods can contain loads of sneaky chemicals that can have side effects on our little one's bodies and behaviours.

Fortunately, there are some simple swaps that we can make by reading ingredients lists.

Here is this week's supermarket food swap and if anyone is in the mood for baking, we've got that covered too.

PREP: 5 min | COOK: 20 min | MAKES: 8

CHUNKY MONKEY COOKIES

- 1 cup very ripe banana, mashed
- ½ cup desiccated coconut
- ½ cup quick oats or quinoa flakes
- ¼ cup dark chocolate chips
- ½ tsp cinnamon

- 01 Preheat oven to 160°C.
- 02 Add all ingredients to a bowl and mix until combined.
- 03 Roll out 8 balls and place on a lined baking tray. Flatten with hands. Bake in the oven for 20 minutes or until golden.
