This term the children have continued their vacation care interest of sustainability and what that means for us at home and at school. The children have started an ongoing group project that they will work on together. Our theme is Taking care of the world, and our focus bible verse comes from 2 Corinthians 6:1 'We are workers together with God'. We are learning about all the little things that can make a big difference when we work together with those around us and with God to make the world a cleaner, happier place.

Thank you to the Keogh family who have donated a worm farm for the OSHC children, we are currently researching what we need and how we need to take care of it. Luca did an amazing job, drawing a worm farm for our sustainability project wall.

Over the Easter holidays many of the OSHC families went fishing or spent time at the beach, so we have been looking at different sea animals, and what we need to do to keep the ocean clean and the animals safe.

These activities led us to a conversation about the First Nations people of Australia, and how they took care of this country for thousands of years, how they lived, what they ate and how they protected the land in the harsh Australian environment. And as we have some keen fishermen here at OSHC we looked at the fish traps that the First nation people used from Brewarrina NSW, which is an example of a large fishing operation. We all know that when providing food to our young people, fresh is best however we understand that with our busy lifestyles, packaged foods can be a quick and convenient alternative when packing daily lunchboxes. Unfortunately, a lot of those packaged foods can contain loads of sneaky chemicals that can have side effects on our little one's bodies and behaviours.

Fortunately, there are some simple swaps that we can make by reading ingredients lists.

Here is this week's supermarket food swap and if anyone is in the mood for baking, we've got that covered too.

#### BANANA BLENDER

MUFFINS

- ½ cup tahini
  2 tbsp olive oi

- 1 tbsp vanilla extract
- 11/2 cups wholemeal self

- 2 tosp cacao
  1 tsp cinnamon
  ½ cup chocolate chip
- 01 Preheat oven to 170°C

- **04** Divide mixture across 12 greased muffin tin cups. Bain the oven for **15 minutes**.
