




For the Last Day of Term 2 we are having a Casual Clothes/Silly Socks Day.






### YEAR 9/10 DRAMA CLASS







This term the Year 9/10 Drama students have been working hard to devise their comedy routines for their term assessment.


Students have studied different styles of comedy this semester through workshops, learning how to implement conventions of comedy as well as the elements of drama into their performances.

#### SUPERMARKET SWAP.

PREP: 15 min | MAKES: 12

RECIPE MUMMA

#### BOUNTIFUL **BLISS BALLS**

- · 34 cup almonds
- 1 cup rolled oats

STAGE 1

- 120g (¾ cup) whole pitted dates, softened
- · 2 tbsp coconut oil, melted
- · 2 tbsp desiccated coconut
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- · 1/4 tsp salt
- · 1/4 cup water
- · 40g dark chocolate chips
- 01 Place stage 1 ingredients in a large food processor and process until finely crumbled.
- 02 Add stage 2 ingredients to the food processor. Process until combined, stopping to scrape down sides as needed
- 03 Remove blade and stir in chocolate chips.
- 04 With slightly wet hands, roll out 12 balls. Store in an air tight container in the fridge.
