### YEAR 5 STEM BOAT CHALLENGE

Our brief was to use materials out of the recycling bin to make a boat, and then make it move with the power from a chemical reaction. We watched YouTube videos of how other people had used bicarbonate of soda (a solid) and white vinegar (a liquid) to create CO2 (a gas) to propel their boats forward.

Next, we looked at the materials we had and brainstormed together to come up with a design. We drew this in our books. We then built a prototype based on our designs and tested it in the water.

Some of our boats worked really well, while others had to be completely redesigned. Last week, we finally did the big test. One of the teams had put a lot of effort into working out the optimal ratio of bicarbonate of soda to vinegar, which paid off as this was the boat that was able to sustain high power for the longest time. It was fantastic to see how enthusiastic everyone was and how well the boats worked.

#### Here are some of the things we learned:

"It's not always going to be right the first time."

"If something goes wrong, don't blame it on others."

"Don't take it for granted that you will have time."

"I learned from everyone's mistakes."


