If you know any young families that may be interested, please share this event with them.






Next Friday, 27th October we are honoring the memory of Daniel Morcombe in support of child safety education.

Approximately one in six Australians live with hearing loss and AUSLAN is the official sign language of the Australian deaf community.

AUSLAN is a language that is unique to Australia enabling deaf people to overcome the need to rely on verbal communication. It has its own sentence structure, grammar and vocabulary, which makes it great fun to learn as a second language!

At Carlisle our students had an opportunity to explore the beauty of this language using some simple songs and stories they practised and presented to each other. Some of our own students and teachers at Carlisle are fluent in this language and helped make these activities much more meaningful and engaging.
